# **Outline of position:**

Working with the Exchange House Family Support Team and Offaly Traveller
Movement to develop individualised recovery plans and support Travellers
recovering from mental health issues. Also working with Travellers, in Offaly, to
increase access to mainstream mental health services, and ensure equality of
outcomes for Travellers recovering from Mental illness

### **Duties and Responsibilities:**

- To work as part of the Exchange House Team in locally identified projects to develop and support responses for Travellers recovering from mental health issues. The day to day management will be carried out by Offaly Traveller Movement
- To develop individualised recovery plans with identified Travellers and support and mentor Travellers in implementing their recovery plans
- Develop and work closely with mental health services to ensure culturally appropriate responses
- Advocate on behalf of clients to ensure their needs and rights are being met within mental health care service providers
- Manage a caseload which will be Traveller led and ensure a needs led approach is taken
- To be a member of an integrated team working across disciplines with Travellers most at risk of mental health issues
- To work with individuals and families to overcome crisis situations
- To work directly with individual and families in conjunction with other services within Exchange House and relevant outside agencies

- Ensure sustainability of the project by supporting and developing appropriate structures which ensure sustainability
- To adhere to the Family Support Service established system of record keeping in relation to clients, work records, statistics etc
- To furnish the involved director, manager and / or health co-ordinator with records as required
- To provide written reports to team leader, Director, Board of Directors and Genio when required
- Flexibility is a requirement of this position
- To carry out any other duties as requested by the Director or board of Directors

## **Special Conditions**

- This is a three year funded position subject to completion of 12 months probationary period.
- Outreach and site work will be a part of this work and as such, the use of own car that has up to date NCT, motor tax and class 2 insurance is essential.
